## 4. Jesus was born to save me from my sins.

### A. Jesus was born to save me from the consequences of my sins.

*If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9 (ESV)*

*There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Romans 8:1 (ESV)*

### B. Jesus was born to take away the guilt and shame of my sins.

*...let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Hebrews 10:22 (ESV)*



### C. Jesus was born to set me free from the power of sin.

We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Romans 6:6–7 (ESV)

### D. Jesus was born to set me free from the presence of sin.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 2 Corinthians 5:17 (ESV)

### 1. Jesus was born to save us from our sins.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” Matthew 1:18–21 (ESV)

And the angel said to them, “Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.
