4. Christians must remember to ______ themselves to good works in order to create good will to open the door for people to hear the good news.

The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works. These things are excellent and profitable for people.

The Background Of Crete

One of the Cretans, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons." Titus 1:12 (ESV)

1. Christians are to live as _____ citizens.

Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. Titus 3:1–2 (ESV)

A. We are to be subject to our leaders.

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities... Romans 13:1 (ESV)

i. There is no authority except what God establishes.

... For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. Romans 13:1 (ESV)

He changes times and seasons; <u>he removes kings and sets up kings...</u> Daniel 2:21 (ESV)

ii. Resisting our government is resisting God.

Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment.
Romans 13:2 (ESV)

iii. Government is given by God to restrain evil.

For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. <u>Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval</u>,... Romans 13:3 (ESV)

iv. Government is given the authority to take life.

...for he is God's servant for your good. <u>But if you do wrong, be</u> afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of <u>God</u>, an avenger who carries out <u>God's wrath on the wrongdoer</u>. Romans 13:4 (ESV)

v. Christians are to pay their taxes.

For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed. Romans 13:6–7 (ESV)
