What relational networks has God given you? Who are some of the people that you should build a relationship with in those networks?

BRINGING THE BIBLE TO LIFE

> Read John 1:35-42.

John calls Jesus the “Lamb of God.” What does he mean by that? How are John’s words here an example for us in relationships with non-Christians?

Why did the disciples immediately follow Jesus when they heard this? What does this communicate about their deepest need?

Read John 3:27-30. What is John saying here? How does this tie into John’s actions in John 1? What are some ways that you can cultivate this same attitude at home? At work? At school?

Imagine Jesus asked you, “What are you seeking?” as he does to the disciples here. How would you respond? How do the disciples respond? What is significant to Jesus’ answer to their question?



> Read John 1:43-51.

Who introduced Nathanael to Jesus? Discuss the progression in John 1 of people encountering Jesus. What is significant about this? In large part, is this replicable today?

How does knowing that Jesus is the one who chooses people and that he is fully aware of their inner condition and outward circumstances in life help us to relax in our efforts to see people become Christians? What then is our responsibility?

When it comes to talking about Jesus, why do we just need to invite others to meet Jesus, not prove him to them?
