- 2. Read Daniel 3:1-7. What were the two parts of Nebuchadnezzar's strategy to force cultural assimilation? What role did the golden statue play in the plan?
- 3. Tim Tebow is an example of the tension our culture feels when what many feel should be a private faith is displayed in a public world. Can you think of other examples (Christmas trees vs. Holiday trees. Nativity Scenes in public parks)? How can I live my faith in a more public way?
- 4. Read Daniel 3:8-15. As Christians living in a pluralistic world similar to Babylon, what will be the sources of our persecution?
- 5. If we don't face persecution, that may be a sign that something happened to our faith. What is it?
- 6. What is pluralism? Why is pluralism illogical?
- 7. When facing cultural persecution, what are two things we must remember?
- 8. What is the "up" side of not compromising our faith when we face cultural pressure?
- 9. Read Daniel 3:28-29. What amazed Nebuchadnezzar about the way Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were delivered? What does that teach us about the way Jesus delivers us?
- 10. Jesus protected Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego from the flames of Nebuchadnezzar's wrath. When Jesus came at Christmas, what did he come to protect us from?
