Likewise, just as it was in the days of Lot—they were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building, but on the day when Lot went out from Sodom, fire and sulfur rained from heaven and destroyed them all—so will it be on the day when the Son of Man is revealed. Luke 17:28–30 (ESV)

The two angels came to Sodom in the evening, and <u>Lot was sitting in the gate of Sodom</u>. When Lot saw them, he rose to meet them and bowed himself with his face to the earth Genesis 19:1 (ESV)

Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. Hebrews 13:2 (ESV)

1. Big compromises start with <u>little compromises</u>.

and said, "My lords, please turn aside to your servant's house and spend the night and wash your feet. Then you may rise up early and go on your way." They said, "No; we will spend the night in the town square." But he pressed them strongly; so they turned aside to him and entered his house. And he made them a feast and baked unleavened bread, and they ate. Genesis 19:2–3 (ESV)

But before they lay down, the men of the city, the men of Sodom, both young and old, all the people to the last man, surrounded the house. And they called to Lot. "Where are the men who came to you tonight? Bring them out to us, that we may know them." Genesis 19:4–5 (ESV)

just as <u>Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding cities</u>, <u>which likewise indulged in sexual immorality</u> and pursued unnatural desire (wrong flesh desires), serve as an example by undergoing a punishment of eternal fire. Jude 7 (ESV)

2. Don't love the comforts of my culture more than <u>holiness</u> and <u>protecting</u> my family.

Lot went out to the men at the entrance, shut the door after him, and said, "<u>I beg you, my brothers</u>, do not act so wickedly. Behold, <u>I have two daughters who have not known any man. Let me bring them out to you, and do to them as you please</u>. Only do nothing to these men, for they have come under the shelter of my roof." Genesis 19:6–8 (ESV)

3. Be careful who I have as friends. I will become like them.

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: <u>neither the sexually immoral</u>, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor <u>men who practice homosexuality</u>, nor thieves, nor the

greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. 1 Corinthians 6:9–11 (ESV)

4. The more I tolerate sin, the less sensitive I become to sin.

But they said, "Stand back!" And they said, "This fellow came to sojourn, and he has become the judge! Now we will deal worse with you than with them." Then they pressed hard against the man Lot, and drew near to break the door down. But the men reached out their hands and brought Lot into the house with them and shut the door. And they struck with blindness the men who were at the entrance of the house, both small and great, so that they wore themselves out groping for the door. Genesis 19:9–11 (ESV)

Then the men said to Lot, "Have you anyone else here? Sons-in-law, sons, daughters, or anyone you have in the city, bring them out of the place. For we are about to destroy this place, because the outcry against its people has become great before the Lord, and the Lord has sent us to destroy it." So Lot went out and said to his sons-in-law, who were to marry his daughters, "Up! Get out of this place, for the Lord is about to destroy the city." But he seemed to his sons-in-law to be jesting. Genesis 19:12–14 (ESV)

- God's judgment is always <u>fair</u>. God's grace through Jesus is unfair.
- Have God conversations <u>early</u> or people won't take me <u>seriously</u>.

As morning dawned, the angels urged Lot, saying, "Up! Take your wife and your two daughters who are here, lest you be swept away in the punishment of the city." But he lingered. So the men seized him and his wife and his two daughters by the hand, the Lord being merciful to him, and they brought him out and set him outside the city. Genesis 19:15–16 (ESV)

7. When God tells me do do something, don't procrastinate.

And as they brought them out, one said, "Escape for your life. Do not look back or stop anywhere in the valley. Escape to the hills, lest you be swept away." And Lot said to them, "Oh, no, my lords. Behold, your servant has found favor in your sight, and you have shown me great kindness in saving my life. But L cannot escape to the hills, lest the disaster overtake me and I die. Behold, this city is near enough to flee to, and it is a little one. Let me escape there—is it not a little one?—and my life will be saved!" He said to him, "Behold, I grant you this favor also, that I will not overthrow the city of which you have spoken. Escape there quickly, for I can do nothing till you arrive there." Therefore the name of the city was called Zoar. Genesis 19:17–22 (ESV)

8. Don't downsize on sin. Run from sin.

The sun had risen on the earth when Lot came to Zoar. Then the Lord rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulfur and fire from the Lord out of heaven. And he

overthrew those cities, and all the valley, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and what grew on the ground. <u>But Lot's wife, behind him, looked back, and she became a pillar of salt.</u> Genesis 19:23–26 (ESV)

On that day, let the one who is on the housetop, with his goods in the house, not come down to take them away, and likewise let the one who is in the field not turn back. Remember Lot's wife. Whoever seeks to preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will keep it. Luke 17:31–33 (ESV)

9. When God calls me to leave something, <u>LET IT GO</u>. I can't take my old life with me.


And Abraham went early in the morning to the place where he had stood before the Lord. And he looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah and toward all the land of the valley, and he looked and, behold, the smoke of the land went up like the smoke of a furnace. So it was that, when God destroyed the cities of the valley, God remembered Abraham and sent Lot out of the midst of the overthrow when he overthrew the cities in which Lot had lived. Genesis 19:27–29 (ESV)
