And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee. Mark 1:27–28 (ESV)

Mark 1:21-28 – How To Make A Demon Scream

1. Jesus has more authority than the wisest <u>teachers</u>.

And <u>they went into Capernaum</u>, and immediately on the Sabbath <u>he</u> <u>entered the synagogue and was teaching</u>. And <u>they were astonished at his</u> <u>teaching</u>, for <u>he taught them as one who had authority</u>, and not as the <u>scribes</u>. Mark 1:21–22 (ESV)

For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and <u>so also were James and John, sons of</u> Zebedee, who were partners with Simon... Luke 5:9–10 (ESV).

Application

The words of Jesus are authoritative <u>truth</u>, not speculative <u>opinion</u>.

The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows how bad it is? Jeremiah 17:9 (NLT)

The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand. Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him. John 3:35–36 (ESV)

2. Jesus has authority over the <u>demonic</u> world.

And immediately there was <u>in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit.</u> <u>And he cried out...</u> Mark 1:23 (ESV)

1. What was a demon possessed man doing in the <u>synagogue</u>?

And no wonder, <u>for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light</u>. 2 Corinthians 11:14 (ESV)

Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times <u>some will depart</u> from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons... 1 Timothy 4:1 (ESV)

You are of your father the devil, and your will is to do your father's desires. He was a murderer from the beginning, and <u>does not stand</u> in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies. John 8:44 (ESV)

But you must remember, beloved, the predictions of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ. They said to you, "<u>In the last time there will be</u> scoffers, following their own ungodly passions." It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit. Jude 17–19 (ESV)

2. Why was there so much demonic activity in the time of <u>Jesus</u>?

1.

"<u>What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?</u> <u>Have you come to destroy</u> <u>us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God</u>." Mark 1:24 (ESV)

You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe— <u>and shudder!</u> James 2:19 (ESV)

And <u>whenever the unclean spirits saw him, they fell down before him</u> and cried out, "You are the Son of God." Mark 3:11 (ESV)

And when Jesus had stepped out of the boat, immediately there met him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit... And crying out with a loud voice, he said, "<u>What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son</u> of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." Mark 5:2+7 (ESV)

...The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil. 1 John 3:8 (ESV)

But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "<u>Be silent, and come out of him!</u>" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. Mark 1:25–26 (ESV)

And he called the twelve together and <u>gave them power and</u> <u>authority over all demons and to cure diseases...</u> Luke 9:1 (ESV)

Then some of the itinerant Jewish exorcists undertook to invoke the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul proclaims." Seven sons of a Jewish high priest named Sceva were doing this. But the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and Paul I recognize, but who are you?" And the man in whom was the evil spirit leaped on them, mastered all of them and overpowered them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. Acts 19:13–16 (ESV)
